Examination Rules:

- Assessment shall consist of Continuous assessment (CA) and End of Semester Examination (ESE).
- **Weightage: 75%** for ESE & 25% for CA
- The CA towards 25 marks will be a continuous activity and at least two written tests must be conducted for a full paper of 4/6 credits
 - i. Open book tests (not more than two for each paper): 15 marks (with the concerned teacher deciding which books are to be allowed for this purpose)
 - ii. General Performance 10 MarksNote- The teacher should select a variety of mechanism for evaluation of this part such as –
 1. Active participation in the class
 2. Assignment
 3. Extension work etc.
- ESE for the remaining 75% marks will be conducted by the University.
- A student has to obtain 40 % marks in the combined examination of CA and ESE with a minimum passing of 30 % in both these separately.
- To pass the degree program, a student will have to obtain a minimum aggregate of 40% marks (E and above in grade point scale) in each course.
- If a student misses an internal assessment examination he/she will have a second chance with the endorsement of the Principal in consultation with the concerned teacher. Such a second chance shall not be the right of the student.
- Students who have failed in a course may reappear for the ESE only twice in the subsequent period. The student will be finally declared as failed if she/he does not pass in all credits within a total period of three years. After that, such students will have to seek fresh admission as per the admission rules prevailing at that time.
- A student cannot register for the 3rd, 5th, 7th, and 9th semester, if she/he fails to complete 75% of the total credits expected to be ordinarily completed upto 2nd, 4th, 6th and 8th semesters respectively.
- While marks will be given for all examinations, they will be converted into grades. The semester end grade sheets will have only grades and final grade sheets and transcripts shall have grade points average and total percentage of marks (up to two decimal points). The final grade sheet will also indicate the College/Center to which the candidate belongs.

Assessment and Grade point average:

- The system of evaluation will be as follows: Each CA and ESE will be evaluated in terms of marks. The marks for CA and ESE will be added together and then converted into a grade and later a grade point average.
- Results will be declared for each semester.

- After the gain of minimum number of credits towards a completion of a program, a student will get a grade sheet with total grades earned and a grade point average.

- 'B' Grade is equivalent to at least 55% of the marks as per circular No. UGC-1298/[4619]UNI- 4 dated December 11, 1999.
- A seven point grade system [guided by the Government of Maharashtra Resolution No. NGV-1298/[4619]/UNI.4 dt. December 11, 1999 and the University regulations] will be followed.
- If the (C)GPA is higher than the indicated upper limit in the three decimal digit, then higher final grade will be awarded (e.g. a student getting (C)GPA of 4.492 may be awarded 'A' grade).
- For grade improvement a student must reappear for ESE for a minimum 20 credits. These courses will be from the parent. Department (subject). A student can appear only once for the Grade Improvement Program only after the successful completion of PG Degree program and at the end of the next academic year after completion of the Degree and within two years of completion of the Degree.
- The formula for CGPA will be based on Weighted Average. The final CGPA will not be printed unless a student earns minimum 180 credits.
- One credit is equivalent to 25 marks for evaluation purpose.
- For ESE the Question Paper shall have 08 question and the students will have to answer 5 Questions. All questions will carry equal marks.

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
